






LPRAP

Helps replace private lead pipes for FREE



Older homes built before the 1980's likely have a lead service line – the pipe that connects the city water supply to your household plumbing.

For decades, DC Water has been replacing lead pipes in the city. At some homes, the portion in public space was replaced with copper, but lead remains in private space.

Your home has a lead pipe in private space. If you believe our records are incorrect, please contact **lead@dcwater.com**.

Why should I apply for LPRAP?

Lead can cause serious health problems if too much enters your body from drinking water or other sources. It can cause damage to the brain and kidneys and can interfere with the production of red blood cells.

The greatest risk of lead exposure is to infants, young children, and pregnant women. Scientists have linked the effects of lead on the brain with lowered IQ in children.

Adults with kidney problems and high blood pressure can be affected by low levels of lead more than healthy adults.

Landlords must disclose the presence of lead pipes to tenants (Code of the District of Columbia §42-3271). LPRAP assists with cost of removal.

How do I receive a free lead pipe replacement?

ALL homeowners enrolled in LPRAP will have 100% of the cost of their replacement paid for by the District and DC Water for their private service line replacement.
