

# District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority (DC Water) was created in 1996, as an independent authority of the District Government.

Washington's NFL franchise played its last home game at RFK Stadium in 1996. RFK had been home to the team since 1961.

# Distribute drinking water to 700,000 residents and 21 million visitors in DC





Collect used water in the District and suburbs and treat it at Blue Plains, the largest advanced wastewater treatment plant in the world.





# Maintain 1,350 miles of water pipes and 1,900 miles of sewer pipes

# dcd drinking water quality

#### Water comes from the Potomac River





and is treated by the Army Corps of Engineers at the Washington Aqueduct. Water is lead free when it leaves the plant and is distributed across the city. However, water that comes out of your faucet, can have lead in it.

Sources of lead include old lead service pipes, lead solder or brass faucets and other fixtures that can contain lead.



# Overall lead levels are historically low in DC, at about 4 ppb



But every home is different, and we need to work together to remove all sources of lead.



## DC Water Clean Rivers Impervious Area Charge (IAC)


Based on the amount of impervious area – rooftops, paved driveways, parking lots, patios – on a property.












DC Water completed the first phase of the DC Water Clean Rivers Project in March, on time and under budget.

Serving People by Lending a Supporting Hand (SPLASH)

- Established in 2001 to help families in financial distress pay their DC Water bill rather than lose service.
- Administered by the Greater Washington Urban League, using funds collected from customers and DC Water employees.
- SPLASH donations have resulted in \$1,261,526 in assistance to needy families.

RiverSmart Rewards Program offers a discount on the DOEE Stormwater Fee.


Clean Rivers IAC Incentive Program offers a Discount on the DC Water impervious Area Charge (IAC).

DOEE manages both programs. You can apply for both discounts online at doee.dc.gov/riversmartrewards

#### High Usage Notification Alerts (HUNA)

Automatically notifies you if your water usage is higher than normal for 4 consecutive days.

Spike in water usage could indicate a plumbing problem such as a leaking toilet.
