In celebration of Drinking Water Week, DC Water is sponsoring a poster and poetry contest for K-12 public school students in Washington, DC from March 19-April 20. This year's theme is **"Protect the Source"**.

It is important that students not only know the source of their water, but also that they are empowered to protect their waterways in order to enhance quality of life for all. Through this contest, students are encouraged to explore where their water comes from in the District and to ponder on creative ways to ensure the health of our watersheds for themselves and generations to come.

Theme

Posters and Poetry should reflect the theme of the contest.

Eligibility

Open to all K-12 students at all schools within the District of Columbia. Students who attend public, private, charter and home school are invited and encouraged to participate.

The POSTER contest is open to all students in grades K-6
The POETRY contest is open to all students in grades 7-12

Prizes

POSTER 1st Place - \$100, 2nd Place - \$50, 3rd Place - \$50
POETRY 1st Place - \$100, 2nd Place - \$50, 3rd Place - \$50

Honorable mentions may be selected in each category. Winners will be presented their framed work, a monetary prize and be featured on our website. Announcement and presentation of winners to occur May 10 and May 11.



Contest Rules

- All entries must reflect the theme of the contest.
- One original entry per student. Any plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification.
- All entries must be labeled on the back in the upper left hand corner with the student's full name, grade, school, and teacher's name.
- All entries must be accompanied by a completed entry form.
- POSTERS must be no larger than 11x17 inches in landscape or portrait format.
 - Students may use any colors or media (crayon, marker, pencil, paint, etc.) to create their poster.
- POETRY must be submitted on one standard 8.5x11 inch letter size paper.
 - Any style of poetry is acceptable.
 - Entries may be handwritten or typed.
